native podcasts

Native podcasts are created by a company, organisation, or hobbyist and then placed on a website from where they can be listened to. It is important to be able to listen to the podcast directly from a website and not just through a link to one or more streaming platforms.

A. Podcast-related revenue of up to €10,000

Your licence fee consists of a fixed amount of €120 per year. You can create and upload as many podcasts with music as you like with this annual licence.

Revenue comprises subscription fees, subsidies, grants, donations, advertising and sponsorship revenues, as well as gifts and contributions.

B. Podcast-related revenue of more than €10,000

Your licence fee is calculated based on 1.2% of your income, including subscription fees, advertising, subsidies, etc.

streaming platforms

Streaming or hosting platforms are usually accessible via a website or app, always on-demand. The service is offered via subscription, both freemium and premium, and includes a wide range of podcasts.

The licence fee is based on 1.2% of the revenue generated, inclusive of subscription fees, subsidies, grants, donations, advertising and sponsorship revenues, as well as gifts and contributions.
